### 3. How to use this medicine For oral use For babies from 3 months old

- Directions Detach one sachet from strip of 4.
- Babies 3-6 months With the baby in an upright or sitting position. Use a spoon.

Slowly give the baby half a sachet at a time into the front of the baby's mouth. Check the granules have fully dissolved before giving the remaining half.

- Babies over 6 months With the baby in an upright or sitting position. Slowly pour the contents of the sachet into the front of the baby's

mouth a little at a time. Alternatively use a spoon.

- Ensure the granules fully dissolve in the baby's mouth.
- Use one sachet every 2 hours for a maximum of 6 doses during any 24 hour period.
- Consult a doctor or qualified healthcare practitioner if the symptoms worsen or persist for more than 7 days or if any side effects occur.
- Do not use more sachets than the label/leaflet tells you to.

• If you forget to give this medicine to the baby, continue with the usual dose at the usual time. It

does not matter if you have missed a dose. Do not give a double dose to make up for a missed dose. If you accidentally give the baby too much consult your doctor or pharmacist as soon as possible.

## 4. Possible side effects

This medicine is not expected to cause any side effects. However, consult a doctor or qualified healthcare practitioner if the symptoms worsen, or persist for more than 7 days or if any side effects occur.
